Gilbert v. Kentucky Cabinet of Health and Family Services (Franklin, Ky, Cir. Ct.)

This case is an appeal of an administrative order, which found that a physician and his wholly owned corporation had failed to obtain a certificate of need before opening three MRI facilities. The physician contends that the facilities were a part of his private office, and he therefore fell within a statutory exemption to the certificate of need law.

On July 5, 2005, the Litigation Center, with the Kentucky Medical Association, filed a memorandum of law in support of Dr. Gilbert.

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
